On November 30th, 40 members of the Village Vettes Corvette Club cruised to Deland to tour the




Stetson Mansion Christmas Spectacular. Amazingly, for the most part, we were able to stay together for the

Meet Your President and His Lady:

Gene and Bette McConkey came to The Villages in 2009, toured and purchased in the same weekend. Initially they moved into the Bonita neighborhood. After Gene retired, that house was not large enough for both of them, so they had a larger unit built in Gilchrist. This home was five years old in December and has weathered well.

Gene and Bette moved to The Villages from Mukwonago, WI, a suburb 25 miles SW of Milwaukee. Bette worked for C & H Distributors, a distributor of industrial products, as a manager in the accounts payable department. Gene was employed by Haldex Brake Products, a manufacturer of air brake devices. Gene's assignment was to work with the major trailer manufacturers East of The Mississippi. Gene and Bette have two kids, a son that resides in San Diego and a daughter that lives in Chicago.

The McConkey's purchased their first Corvette, an '86 coupe in 1993. It was a two-tone brown over brown car that was very rough. They mothered the car for a couple of years and had it running. Their plan was to drive Route 66 from Chicago, IL to Santa Monica, CA. Just as they were about to depart, Gene latched onto a '93 coupe, polo green, tan interior, a very pretty car. That is the car they finally drove on Route 66, a magnificent trip as Gene described. The Route 66 Trip was in year 2000. CORVETTE FACT

Did you know that in 1994, Corvette experimented with a Copper Metallic exterior color (code 66)? After producing only 116 units, the Copper Metallic was dropped. It seems Corvette had a problem with quality concerns (the Copper Metallic paint on the rubber front and rear bumpers failed to match the body color).
